

CSULB University Housing and Residential Life Fact Sheet

University Housing and Residential Life's mission is to cultivate a welcoming, safe, and inclusive environment for a mass student population that focuses on individual and social development. Housing encourages responsible citizenship and meaningful engagement by holding high-quality initiatives and services. Housing and Residential Life offers students three different on (and off) campus villages along with internet access, laundry facilities, a service center, and a dining hall.

Villages

The two villages on campus include Parkside Village and Hillside Village, while our Beachside Village is about 1.5 miles off-site. Our villages offer diverse thematic communities grouped by floors, halls, or buildings in which residents with common interests can live together. These communities help students transition to college through collective supporting networks. Parkside and Hillside feature double and single rooms, while Beachside provides triples as well as doubles and singles.

Community Building

Housing's faculty and staff ensure that educational and recreational activities are provided to residents throughout the school year. The Residential Hall Association (RHA) is responsible for residential events including galas, casino nights, and more. Village residential assistants also hold events for individual building residents.

Dining

Residents have the opportunity to purchase a yearly meal plan allowing them access to the dining hall (not included in room rates). Meal plans are mandatory for all students living in campus housing.

Statistics

- 93% on-campus housing is the most convenient option.
- 93% feel that living on campus provides a safe and secure experience.
- 92% said living on campus helped them acclimate to CSULB.
- 89% living on campus enhanced their overall experience at CSULB.
